Luther on Apologetics

You will find the attached quotations from Martin Luther of interest. They reveal his understanding and use of apologetics. Here is one:

Paul adduces two kinds of proof (in refutation of their false teaching) in support of his message, or Gospel, which he has preached concerning Christ's resurrection. First, he points out that he took this from Scripture and that he proves this with Scripture. In the second place, he cites his own experience and that of many others who saw the resurrected Christ. For it is the mark of a fair man to prove and attest what he proclaims and says, not only with words but also with deed and example both of himself and others. (Luther's Works, vol. 28; Saint Louis: CPH)

How We Can Help, and How You Can Help

Throughout the centuries the Christian Church has provided a defense and evidence for the truth of Christianity. Faith in Jesus Christ is not blind. Evidence for Christianity is amazing, overwhelming, and sets it apart from all other religions and worldviews. Apologetics was a key factor and emphasis in the early Christian Church. And it had to be: Christianity was a small fish swimming upstream against a flood of paganism, polytheism, and deceptive philosophies. The case had to be made for its truth, and for its claims about the person and work of Jesus Christ. And at the same time the Church had to show how other religions and ways of thinking and living could never ever satisfy man's true and greatest needs. And so that's what early Christians did.

The Christian Church today is very similar. We live in a post-Christian culture. Some worldviews and ideologies have taken society by storm, despite the fact that they are not only deceptive but so disconnected from reality. And yet we find them promoted and embedded everywhere in culture, pushing true Christianity further and further to the outskirts, and often taking Christians, young Christians, captive in the process. And so the CAW also focuses on worldviews – identifying and explaining in what ways they conflict with the truth of Christianity.

Apologetics and worldviews. That's what we do.

I invite you to see how we might be of assistance to you as an individual, to your family, to your church, to your Christian school, to your homeschool or coop, or to your Christian college. We have a number of resources, a lot of good information, and Christian apologists who can even come to where you are.

I also invite to support us in our efforts. At this time, we are the only biblical and confessional Lutheran church body to have both an apologetics Board and an apologetics Center. Besides your prayers, you can support us in two ways. First, spread the word to others. But also, support us financially. We are self-supporting, dependent on donations from people like you. Your first obligations are to your family and your church. But if you can and the extent to which you can, please support the Center for Apologetics and Worldviews.

Apologetics, when done right and in accord with Scripture and our Confessions, points to Christ – his person, his work, and the salvation he accomplished. If apologetics is not done with this in mind, it is not Christian apologetics. The Center for Apologetics
