(1) Those who are sick and don't know it (the post-Christian)

(2) Those who are sick and know it (the Pagan)

(3) Those who have found the cure (the Christian)

"Modern Theology and Biblical Criticism" (4 bleats)

(1) Some biblical critics lack literary judgment

(2) Some wrongly claim that the real teaching of Christ was lost and has only recently been recovered

(3) Some wrongly claim that miracles don't occur
